

Changing Community Trajectories

The other day I received a letter from a nonprofit organization that I support that helps conserve land from deforestation. They shared with me that my small donation, added to the other donations they received, had allowed them to save acres of land for future generations. I felt so good about that, and I thought wow, I wonder how much our donors would appreciate knowing that nationally only 10% of infants and toddlers receive early

intervention services, but at South Central LAMP all children we serve receive assessments?

These assessments allow us to refer children to the right services when needed. In the 30 years we have been serving children, we've helped them receive glasses, hearing tests, speech and language services, behavioral support, and autism services – **all free of charge**. Left undiagnosed, these children would have suffered the fate of either struggling as youth with a disability, possibly leading to depression and feelings of low self-worth. Eventually, these struggles would affect their academic career or as adults, possibly limiting career options and job advancement.

Another interesting fact is that adult programs like ours, that encourage positive parenting skills, reduce incidents of child abuse and neglect. If you think about the 30 years that South Central LAMP has been providing these classes, you can't help but realize that, as a collective, we have changed the trajectory of generations.

In America one in eight children face hunger every day. At South Central LAMP our weekly food distribution, food drives, and Family Advocacy resources prevent families from suffering from hunger. We always ensure that all our families receive the services and the support they need, especially when going through tough financial times.

I don't know if you know how much your donations really affect our community. Often, we give to an organization because of the mission, but I think we forget that behind that mission, there are real people struggling to survive.

I share all this with you because I hope it brings you the joy and optimism I feel, knowing that we are a community of people trying to make this world a better place, by creating equity and supporting those who are marginalized. Thank you to my fellow change-makers, for helping us be the change we wish to see in the world.

2022-2023 PROGRAM SNAPSHOTS

60 LITTLE LEARNERS

Children (ages 0-5) participated in 37,332 hours of onsite early childhood education, making educational and developmental gains that are crucial for Dual Language Learners





24 AMAZING WOMEN

Despite the challenges facing our community, our mothers actively participated in 23,112 hours of parenting and ESL classes, with a retention rate of 95% and attendance rate of 88%, which is remarkable given their personal hardships.

704 RESILIENT FAMILIES

Our weekly community food program in partnership with St. Francis Center, continues to grow, reaching 2,816 unduplicated individuals.





41 ADVOCACY SERVICES

Our Family Advocate conducted 41 home visits, meeting 1:1 with families to discuss their goals for the year, assess their needs (including mental health), and connect them to resources.

21 EXPL AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM

In January 2023, we launched a new STEAM after-school program that served 21 children in grades K-2.





80% PCILA

Eighty percent of mothers increased their knowledge of child development, by supporting their children learning at home, and promoting parent-child attachment through intergenerational activities through our Parent Child Interactive Literacy Activities.

46 CAMP LAMP

Fourty-six children and 20 mothers participated in onsite activities with a camping theme, and the families worked together to create campsites with items needed to survive in the wilderness. They also took field trips to the Natural History Museum, the Los Angeles Arboretum and Underwood Family Farms.





60 WORKSHOPS

In coordination with our partner agencies, we conducted workshops on such topics as Nutrition, Transition to Kinder, Celebrating Diversity, Leadership, Substance Abuse, and Renters Rights. We also held a 5-part financial literacy series.

32 SPANISH CITIZEN'S ACADEMY

Presented by LAPD Newton Division, the Spanish Citizen's Academy educated 32 community members on domestic violence, gang enforcement, drinking and driving, and mental health evaluations.

Child Development Gains

Results of Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 DRDP assessments revealed that all children made developmental gains. Children ages 3-5 showed significant gains, as measured by the percentage who advanced to the top developmental levels – which indicate they're ready or nearly ready for kindergarten entry:

Women's Program Highlights



Family Literacy Program Statistics

Pre- and post-program parent surveys revealed improvements in mothers' support of learning at home and engagement in activities that promote parent-child attachment, including:

- 94% of Mothers read to their child three or more times a week
- 94% of Mothers reported talking with their child's teacher about how to support learning at home
- 88% of Mothers frequently play with their child
- 88% of Mothers reported volunteering in their child's classroom
- 76% of Mothers attend PTA meetings at their child's school
- 76% of Mothers sing songs or play music with their child
- 76% of Mothers talk about the letters of the alphabet with their child

Adult Literacy Gains

To measure English language and literacy gains, we administered CASAS (Comprehensive Adult Student Assessment Systems). Of the 19 mothers with a pre- and post-test score, 100% made a gain. Of those who made a gain, 89% achieved significant gains by reaching their goal or beyond. By the end of the year, 96% of mothers also reported practicing English with their children, up from 78%.


